

Our participation percentage towards contributing for the betterment of the Nehru Hall has been extremely low at **135 out of over 4,000** Nehru hall residents over the preceding 66 years which is **less than 4%**.

There has been nil participation from half of the batches.

Till now we have been able to raise Rs. 5.6 Crores or \$700,000 for the renovation of the Nehru Hall which works out at an average of a little more than Rs. 4 lacs or \$5K USD

Five years that went by so quickly

Parents, brothers, and sisters, all came to send us off at the train station. As we got onto the "bogie" and parked our luggage, we saw the tears. Why did we have to go away? This was it. We were going away and it was never going to be the same. Going in as boys and girls, we were going to come out as men and women in whom a nation had invested its technology dreams.

We got off at the longest platform and got onto a rickshaw that took us to the Nehru Hall. The "nice" seniors guided us to the desk where we checked in and located the rooms we had been assigned. We met our roommates - in the allotted double rooms and little did we realize that they were going to be our friends for life. That day, and the days that followed, joined us with boys from all over India, boys from villages in Haryana, boys from places like Bhagalpur and Nadia and the more sophisticated ones from schools like La Martiniere and St Xavier's. They came from across the country, West Godavari and Kotayam and the smooth ones from the city of dreams, Mumbai. We were bound by just one exam the JEE. A realisation gradually sneaked in - we were never again going to live with such a brilliant and diverse group of boys ever again.

Soon we got set into the rhythm of IIT. It carried us through Hall Days, Exams and PT Files. Somehow we managed to find those who took great class notes and those who made us laugh. We had actors and musicians amongst us. We had those who scored goals for the Hall and could perform pole vaults. We even had bodybuilders and boxers.

It is hard to describe the variety of classes we endured or loved. Some are vivid even after these fifty-five years. We can't forget the beauty of Fourier transform itself in the magical lectures of Prof Seth; or working in the foundry to create a mould to be filled with molten iron.

Professors we don't remember and Professors we can't forget.

Our days at "Institute of our Dreams" were not always without their share of clouds. Fate had a way of intruding and sad news from home and the pressure and expectations sometimes got the better of us. We found our place as best we could as the years flashed by. Every day, as we opened our green doors and saw our friends, we felt comforted and rode our bikes to go to the classes. Getting up in the morning, joining our friends and wingmates, walking down the stairs to the corridors and walking into our dining rooms; lining up for our breakfast with friends around us. On every table there existed a familiarity of friendship. There wasn't much of a breakfast though.

Walking out with our department and hall mates riding around the oval and turning left on Scholars Avenue! Riding past the Jnan Ghosh Stadium, VS Hall, BC Roy Hall, and of course SN Hall. Then through the gate. Yes, the GATE! A simple elegant gate that framed our entrance into the legendary Institute of Technology.

It was just another day. But entering through the gate represented years of dedication and excellence that got us through the crazy hard JEE. What it had taken to get us there made every entrance through that simple gate a special event.

One hot summer day, our idyll was over. As we said our goodbyes, presented the Hall staff with our last gifts and got onto the rickshaw with our belongings, we knew it was over. Our happiest days were over.

A rough and tough world full of challenges and opportunities awaited us.

The Nehruites' footprints across the world

As the early graduates went out and created the "IIT Brand", the graduates from IIT became some of the most sought-after graduates - yes, Nehruites. The transformation was both in India and abroad. While only a few US universities were admitting IITians in 1970, most of whom were Nehruites, today there are numerous US universities with faculty from Nehru Hall.

Some stayed technical and got their Ph.D and joined faculties at various universities around the world, others went on to pursue MBAs from Harvard and Wharton and then ran Corporations and Consulting organizations around the world. Their talent stands recognized and rewarded today.

Both in India and abroad, Nehru Hall graduates are the wealthiest among all college graduates - comparable with the Ivy League graduates from Oxford and Cambridge. Unfortunately, while the Nehruites have prospered, Nehru Hall itself has continued its slow decay with little improvements. *That is what this brochure is about - it is your time to give back*
